

## Philological Library

The Philological Library of FU Berlin does not only contain a great amount of specialist literature, but is also worth a visit due to its architecture. Designed by the famous architect Lord Norman Foster, it was nicknamed “the Berlin brain” shortly after construction.

How to get there:

Within a two minute walking distance from Dahlem-Dorf (U3 metro station, M11 bus stop). When you get out of the metro, take the exit “Königin-Luise-Straße”. Turn right and walk down Königin-Luise-Straße, then turn right into Takustraße. At the first corner (intersection with Lansstraße), you will already see it.

## Domäne Dahlem

Dahlem also has an open-air museum for ecological agriculture and nutrition.

How to get there:

The Domäne Dahlem is very close to the metro station "Dahlem Dorf". Coming with the U3, take the exit "Königin-Luise-Straße", turn left, walk down "Königin-Luise-Straße" for about 50 meters and then cross the street.

## Parks

Thielpark:

Around the metro station "Thielplatz" you find a small park called "Thielpark". Starting from Thielplatz, you can enter the park on both sides of the road. Both parts of the park offer little footpaths and two tiny lakes.

Dreipfuhl:

Walking down the Garystraße towards the metro station "Oskar-Helene-Heim" (U3), you will find the entrance to the Dreipfuhl-Park on your left. This small park extends along the tiny Dreipfuhl lake.
