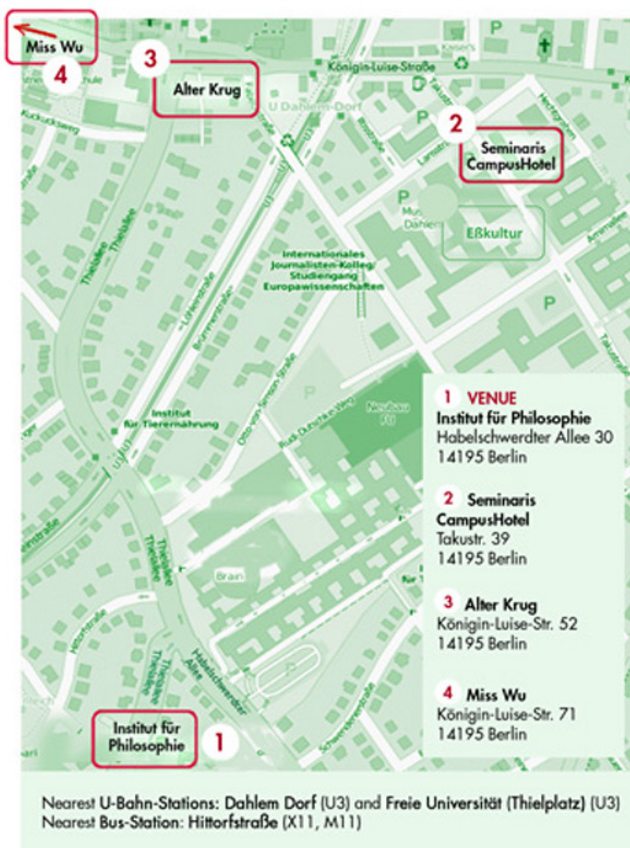


THE AIM OF THIS WORKSHOP is to bring together scholars who teach Chinese Philosophy at European universities and to discuss the contents, methods and visions of teaching and studying Chinese Philosophy in Europe. Our intention is to compare and connect different European perspectives on Chinese Philosophy and to strengthen theoretical and practical cooperation by organizing relevant conferences, workshops, summer schools, mini-seminars, joint courses, lecture series, etc. in the future. Chinese Philosophy in Europe is different from Chinese Philosophy in China. What Chinese Philosophy is and can be, emerges in an open and multi-layered dynamic of interpretation and discussion. Historically, approaches to Chinese Philosophy in European languages have varied considerably. Therefore, we want to reflect on how and why the traditions and perspectives of engagement with Chinese Philosophy differ among various European scholars. Participants in this workshop will reflect on this plurality of approaches and their possible connection to their native language(s) or home place(s). The aim of this workshop is thus to explore—through the discussion of concrete examples—how European philosophical and intellectual traditions influence the perspectives and methods of teaching Chinese Philosophy, and thus shape our understanding of what Chinese Philosophy is and can be. In the current historical and geopolitical situation, the very possibility of developing a philosophically meaningful conversation with Chinese Philosophy faces serious difficulties and challenges. It, therefore, seems necessary to work on a collaborative European response to these difficulties and to reimagine the art of teaching Chinese Philosophy in Europe by engaging in debates about different experiences of working with and philosophizing through Chinese sources.
